From September 19 till 22, Amsterdam is hosting the ISFTD 2024 conference. Frontotemporal dementia is the second most common cause of early-onset dementia, a disorder that presents with behavioural features, language problems, and disturbances of social cognition. Making an early and appropriate diagnosis is still challenging, while the underlying neuropathology and genetics are heterogeneous. Nevertheless, considerable progress has been made in understanding the disorder's molecular underpinnings, and the first therapeutic trials are taking place.

This 14th international conference on FTD and related disorders will cover exciting research developments, including the domains of molecular biology, neuropathology, genetics, biomarkers, neuroimaging, neuropsychology, clinical features, treatment and care.

In the Netherlands, we are strongly interested in scientific research to fight dementia. This is illustrated by The National Dementia Strategy with a € 140,7 M research budget for the upcoming 10 years. Amsterdam is centrally located in Europe, with Schiphol-airport being the second hub airport in the world. Our conference venue has all the modern facilities to host the conference. It is close to the city centre and has excellent public transport connections. Social events will take place in unique locations in a vibrant city at its most attractive season of the year.
